
This newsletter will detail how the Social Farming Support Service for Northern Ireland is continuing to support farmers and promoting Social Farming. The second part of the year has been busy as usual, have a look below at some of the highlights.

Delivery Roundup

There are currently 18 active Social Farms across Northern Ireland. These farms deliver 31 sessions per week to approximately 85 participants. 3 farms have moved out of pilot delivery and into a contract arrangement in the Northern area. Bradkeel Farm in the Western area has recommenced delivery 1 day per week for individuals from mental health services.

We are also working with 45+ new farms to prepare for delivery in 2024.

SOCIAL FARMING DISCUSSION GROUP MEETING

The Social Farms come together quarterly to share learning and offer each other peer support. The final meeting of 2023 was held online with a range of topics covered. The next meeting will be hosted on a Social Farm in the New Year.

The next set of training courses will be delivered in the January to March period of 2024, including:

- Emergency First Aid at Work
- Sageguarding Children and Adults
- Cyber security

SOUTH EAST REGIONAL SOCIAL CARE FARMERS CONFERENCE

This was an opportunity to tell the story of Rural Support's Social Farming Support Service, connect with others in the sector, and learn about the educational visits for young people delivered on-site. We hope to collaborate with this region of the UK further in our shared purpose of developing the provision of Social Farming.

The SFSS hosted a stand at Sandelford School transition information evening in Coleraine. Pupils could find out about opportunities available to them when they leave education, it was great to speak with prospective Social Farmers. SFSS will be attending more outreach events like this going forward into 2024.
